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

PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the first half of May, contact with the enemy continued be be light. The enemy was still unwilling to engage large units, but continued his aniper and harmoning type tection. The enemy's use of landmine warfare remained intense. However, greater number of mines and booky traps were discovered prior to detenation resulting in fewer casualties.

During the last half of May the battalion took part in Operation ALLEN BROOK while the 1st Battalion, 27th Marines, assumed responsibility for this battalion's T.A.O.R.. The enemy force encountered during Operation ALLEN BROOK was estimated to be three separate NVA battalions. The enemy was will equipped, well entrenched, and prepared to defend his positions. A dotailed account of the battalion's action during Operation ALLEN BROOK is contained in the Operations After Action Report. (Tab D to enclosure (1)).



3. TRAINING

e. Garrison training was conducted in the first half of May during the time the companies were located within the Battalion Command Post. Classes consisted of basic military subjects pertinent to RVN. A series of indoctrination lectures were given to newly joined personnel.

b. Schools. Twenty three personnel attended Landmine Warfare, Demolitions and Booby Trap Training. Other schools attended included Staff NCO/NCO Leadership School, Embarkation School, Basic Weapons Repair and Vietnamese Language School.

4. OPERATIONS

a. Battalion's T.A.O.R. (See Tab A to enclosure (1)).

b. Major Operations

- (1) There were two operations run by the battalion that were task organized. (See Tabs B and C to enclosure (1)).
- (2) Operation ALLEV BROOK. (See Tab D to enclosure (1) Operations After Action Report.)
- c. Small Unit Operations. The companies rotated to each of the battalion's operating areas, TU CAU, RIVIERA and DESERT generally on a four day cycle. Day activities included combat patrols and sweeps on the company and platoon size level. Night time activities consisted of patrols and ambushes conducted by squad and fire-teams with saturation patrolling of the rocket belt.

e. Air Support. (See Tab B to enclosure (1) After Action Report)

- (1) Helicopters were used extensively during Operation ALLEN BROOK. The battelion and its attachments were helo-lifted into the axes of operation and resupplied completely by helicopter. During the month, over three hundred and fifty personnel were Med Evaced by helicopter. The majority of these during Operation ALLEN BROOK.
- (2) Tactical Air was also used extensively during the operation for close air support. Over one hundred and forty sorties were flown with all sorties being controlled by a T.A.C.A..
 - f. Artillory Support. (See Tab D to enclosure (1) After Action Report)
- (1) The Second Battalian, 13th Marines provided direct artillary fire support for the battalian. Delta Battary was located at Liberty Bridge to support Operation ALLEN BROOK and was supplemented by general support weapons of the 11th Marines.
- 5. LOCISTICS, EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLY. (See Tab D to enclosure (1) After Action Report)
- a. Supply. To support the battalion during Operation ALLAN BROOK, an ISA was established at IZ number 410, 27th Marines Regimental Headquerters. A Halicopter Support Team from the 5th Shore Party Battalion assisted in the operation of the ISA.
 - b. Ordnesse. During Operation ALLEN BROUK ammunition was staged and supplied to the battalion from the ISA. Weapons that were evacuated from the field were either repaired by personnel from the battalion armory or by the Contact Team supplied by FSR. Many weapons were quickly returned to the field.
 - c. <u>Medical</u>. A Battalion Aid Station was established at the LSA to handle Med Evacs from Operation ALLEN BROOK. Most NBC and the less seriously injured were treated at the ISA and in many cases returned to the field. Those casualties with more serious injuries were evacuated directly to hospital facilities.

- d. The detained stated that his battalion is armed with three and regard heavy machine guns, but he has no knowledge of them possessing mortars. He gave his battalion's location at AT 9753.

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- e. Questioning of villagers at AT 967557 on 24 May revealed that an undetermined number of NVA passed through their village several days before carrying about 20 dead. This group was also reported to have several women with them, who are probably nurses.
- f. Mother detained stated he was a member of the 2nd Bn, 68th Regt, that his unit is armed with four 82MM mortars, nineteen 60MM mortars, nine heavy machine guns, fifteen to twenty light machine guns, RPGIs, twenty to thirty BARS and numerous AK-47's, over half of which are new. Morale in his battalion is also low, due mainly to air strikes.
- g. It should be noted that both detainess stated that many of the men in their battalions wanted to "CHIEU HOI" but didn't know what procedure to follow. Most equipment captured was in fairly new condition. The field packs were well stocked with medical supplies in contrast to the detainess statement as to their lack of supplies.
- h. Very few surprise firing devices were found during the operation. It is believed that the large amount of enemy movement and the arrival of new troops into the area limits extensive use of such warfare.
- i. Vegetation consists of open areas with dried up river beds and sandy area. Thick tree lines offer good cover and concealment. Very few rice paddies were observed in this area. Observation and fields of fire are fairly good. Tree lines have cleared areas to their front which makes them very dangerous avenues of approach. Movement of large groups is easily detected due to the amount of open area.
- j. Terrain is flat with mostly grass and light scrubs in the open areas. Land is utilized for farming crops of corn, peanuts, and tabacco, with scattered areas of rice. Due to the absence of most of the civilian population, civil action/psychological warfare evaluation is negligible.
- 9. Mission. To deny free movement to the enemy and the use of certain terrain. To keep the enemy off balance and under constant pressure.
- 10. Concept of Operation. The initial concept of the operation was to helo-lift two rifle companies and a Command Group in to the southern portion of the area of operations to relieve the pressure on a battalion already committed. Companies K and L together with the 81MM Mortar Platoon, Security Troops, and Forward Command Group elements were lifted into the vicinity of AN TAM (1) (AT 961516). Battery D, 2nd Bn, 13th Marines was located at Liberty Bridge, and provided fire support from that location. An Engineer Team remained attached to the Command Group and was utilized on an as required basis by the companies. Each company had one artillery FO Tm and an HST Tm assigned to them. The HST personnel were later centralized under the Battalion Command Group. The Tank Platoon, which was attached on 26 May 1968, was for the most part used as direct support of the two lead companies with a heavy section to one and a light to the other.

1. Execution. This battalion was alerted to the pending operation a 8 May 1968 and was given the general area of operation. Visual econnaissance flights were arranged and on Il May 1968, the Commanding Officer, S-3, Air and Artillery Lidison Officers, flew to the area, made a visual reconnaissance of the island and landed near the mobile Command Post of the 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines for a briefing with the Battalion Commander. On 13 May 1968, Company I was alerted and flown but to the area of operation and placed under OPCON of the 7th Marines. On 16 May 1968, the remainder of the battalion was alerted, except for Company M, to be prepared to move by truck company convoy to Liberty Bridge, and to move on fact to the area of operations. The LSA was to be located at the 27th Marines Landing Zone, number 410. On 17 May, at approximately 0830 the truck convoy arrived at the 3/27 CP and troops and equipment were loaded. During the course of the movement toward Liberty Bridge, the convoy was ordered to report to Landing Zone 410 and the battalion was alerted to be prepared to lift by helicopter into the area of operation. This order was received approximately 1000 and the convoy arrived at Landing Zone 410 at about 1045. There was some delay in the arrival of the helicopters, however, at about 1300 the first elements of Company K were airborne.

Still another dolay was experienced when a coordination problem arose in the air preparation of the landing zone. Once this problem was overcome the troop helicopters landed in the zone in the vicinity of AT 961512 at approximately 1500, on 17 May 1968. After the initial delay the lift went smoothly and all elements were in the zone by approximately 1730. The LZ was hit by sporadic mortar fire during the course of discharging troops resulting in 4 WIA.

The helicopter landing of this battalion relieved the pressure on company I which had been in heavy contact during most of the day and had suffered relatively heavy casualties. Company I was still OPCON to 3/7 at this time, and the plan was to link up the battalion with Company I prior to darkness.

As the bottalion moved forward it was subjected to occasional mortar and small arms harrassing fire. Company K moved into the tree line in the vicinity of AT 962522 and came under intense small arms and automatic weapons fire. Company L moved to the east of Company K and mot little resistance. Fir and artillery missions were called in support of Company K, and at about 1930, two platoons of Company K were successful in linking with Company I. Company L, was located to the east in the vicinity of AT 967523, and the lommand Group, with one platoon of Company K, were located in the vicinity AT 963518. Those positions were maintained throughout the night. At 1910H OPCON of Company I passed to the 27th Marines and remained until he end of the operation. Casualties sustained on the 17th of May were as follows: Company I - 50 WIA and 15 KIA, Company K - 14 WIA and 6 KIA, Company L - 4 minor WIA's. Enemy casualties could not be iccurately assessed at this time due to darkness.

On the morning of 18 May 1958, at 0830 Company E moved from it's night cosition to link up with Company I and Company K. The Command Group with



the platoon of Company K also began to move toward the rendevous point. approximately 0940 the Command Group with one platoon of Company K plined Companies I and K (-) in the vicinity of AT 959526. While consolidating and attempting to expand the perimeter, friendly units came under small arms fire from LE BAC (2). Company K was moved to the North and Company L, approaching from the East was diverted North to assist in the action. Initially it was thought the enemy force to be nothing more than one or two snipers, however, it soon became clear that a major enemy force was involved. The volume of fire became exceedingly heavy. Lead elements of Companies K and L were pinned down and could not be extracted. As the battle continued, heat began to take its tell, and heat casualties soon exceeded the number of battle casualties. Flak jackets, which had been worn by all hands, were discarded. Water became a critical item. Company M, which had been alerted previously to replace Company I, began arriving at 1500. Both Companies K and L and the Forward Command Group had been in contact continually since about 0940. Air and artillery missions were called in support of the troops in contact, but since friendly units were in such close proximity to the enemy it was not possible to bring supporting arms to bear on all the enemy positions. Company M, upon arrival, was committed to the action in support of Company K, which had suffered a considerable number of battle and heat casualties. Company I was withdrawn from the area of operations utilizing turn about helicopters that transported Company M. Company K was replaced by Company M and withdrawn to a defensive position approximately 250 meters to the rear. The battle raged throughout the day until finally at night fall, friendly units were able to break contact, tetrieve all wounded, most of their dead and withdraw to an area from which air and artillery could be gully brought to bear on the enemy positions. All units withdrew to the defensive position established earlier by Company K. Two rifle companies from 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines also joined the battalion at this position at about 1900. The battalion set in at this location (vic AT 959524) for the night. Friendly casualties for this day were placed at 15 KIA, 78 WIA, and 6 MIA, with 20 enemy KIA. Casualty figures were not confirmed at this time due to the tactical situation.

On 19 May 1968, at 0630, patrols were sent out to the battle area to finish picking up equipment which had not been retrieved the night before. At the same time units within the Battalion Command Post began a detailed search of that area. This was the same area through which the battalion had previously passed when attempting to link up with India company. At 0800 three dead NVA were discovered together with a machine gun tripod, ammunition, 1 AK-50 machine gun barrel and other items. At _030 two ChiCom radios were found and one dead NVA. Three hundred pounds of rice and 200 pounds of corn were discovered and destroyed at 1035. everal more NVA dead were discovered together with quantities of equipment including a heavy machine gun, AK-47 rifles, SKS rifles, grenades, ammunition, and field telephone. A prisoner was found at 1215 who claimed to be a cook for the NVA but claimed he was not a NVA himself. All captured equipment and the prisoner were evacuated to 27th Marines Regimental Headquarters. As this search was being conducted, air and artillery missions were being fired into the tree line of the previous day's action prior to sending Company L back into the area to search it thoroughly, and at about



o the village of AN QUYEN (1). They observed a young Vietnamese male, ho, when he saw the Marines, ran away into the tall elephant grass adjacent to the village. The partol pursued this individual and in the process of searching in the grass for him discovered seven fresh camp fires and signs of recent occupancy of about 35 people. The patrol returned to the battalion's position and the area around AN QUYEN (1) was fired on periodically throughout the night by artillery.

On 23 May at 0800, Companies K and M commenced an offensive sweep North from the battalion's night defensive positions to the SONG THU BON River. Several air strikes and artillery missions were called by both companies but neither company made contact with the enemy and both returned to the battalion's position by late afternoon. The battalion remained in position for the night.

At 240700 the battalion moved from its night position towards LE BAC Companies K and L comprised the lead elements with the Command Group and Company M following in trace. At 1130, after crossing a dry river bed, the lead units began to receive sporadic small arms fire from a tree line to their front. Company K continued to move forward until 1230, when they encountered heavy resistance from prepared positions 140 LD BAC (1). Company K remained in heavy contact while Company L received only light sniper fire. Company M was ordered forward to assist Company K in extricating their wounded and dead as well as those pinned down by the heavy enemy fire. Company M moved through the CP Group with two platoons, leaving one back for CP security. The two companies linked up at about 1400 and Company M in conjunction with Company K attempted to withdraw North to allow supporting arms to neutralize the enemy positions. By 1630 all friendly units were clear of the area and air and artillery fire was called in on LE BAC (1). During the course of the contact both close air support and artillery fire was employed. Once disengaged, Companies M, K, and L pulled back North toward the Battalion CB and reconnaissance elements were dispatched to the vicinity of PHU TAY (2) to locate a suitable CP site. At about 1700 all units commerced moving to the night time positions in the vicinity of AT 954545. Perimeter defenses were established and re-supply was completed. During the night about 100 to 150 rounds of small arms fire and 4 to 6 mounds of 60MM mortar fire were received in the battalion's position resulting in two minor USMC WIA's. A few hours later approximately 20 rounds of mortar fire fell outside the battalion's perimeter. It appeared as though the enemy was attempting to locate the battalion's position and was confused as to its location in as much as the battalion had not returned my fires in response to their earlier harrassing fire. LATES TO LA

Begining at 0712 on the 25th, artillery preparatory fires were called in LE BAC (1). These were followed by air missions at 0845. Again at 1000 ore artillery prep fires were called in on the target area and at 1002 company L was ordered to move out toward objective NOVAMBER, (LE BAC (1)). As Company L moved toward the objective another air strike was made and at 1045, Companies M and K with the Command Group again reached the dry stream bed just North of the objective, while Company L moved through the objective approximately 150 meters to the front. At 1205 Company L took



100, Company L departed the Battalion CP. In the meantime, more enemy quirment, bodies and documents were discovered in the Battalion CP solution.

Upon arriving in the battle area, Company I discovered a number of dead NVA, a few weapons and five friendly KIA. By the end of the day the cummulative casualties were as follows: Friendly 40 KIA, 159 WIA; Enemy 66 (NVA) KIA, 1 (VC) detainee. The battalion spent the night of 19-20 May in the same location.

On the morning of the 20th at 0800 Company I and K of 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines, departed 3/27 Battalion CP to rejoin their parent battalion. At 0800, 3/27 moved to the East with Companies L and K in the lead, and with the Command Group and Company M in trace. While enroute, Company K received sporadic sniper fire. Upon reaching coordinates AT 970522 the battalion formed a perimeter with the three companies and set up night defensive positions. There had been no significant contacts and casualties both enemy and friendly remained unchanged. At 2230 several NVA were surprised by a Kilo Company listening post. One became discriented and ren into the Battalion CP. As he crossed in front of a Company L defensive position, he was wounded by small arms fire and captured. He was wearing an NVA uniform and was armed with an AK-47 rifle. He was treated, interrogated, and medevaced the following morning.

At 211150 the battalion began moving to the North toward objective ECHO, the village complex of PHU DONG (2). At approximately 1355 at coordinates AT 974532, the battalion's lead elements began receiving small arms and sniper fire. Artillery and air strikes were called on the enemy positions, a mimber of heat casualties were evacuated, and both air and artillery missions continued. The battalion pulled back and prepared right defensive positions in the vicinity of AT 972537. At 212235 Company L in defensive positions received 5 to 6 rounds of 60MM mortar fire while at about the same time Company M received small arms fire and 6 rounds of 81MM mortars. Small arms fire was returned and artillery missions were called on suspected enemy mortar positions.

On 22 May at 0835 the battalion moved out to sweep from its night positions North to AN CUYEN (1). Preparatory fires were fired at coordnates AT 972544. Sniper fire wounded two Marines, neither seriously, and the battalion continued to advance. Another prep fire mission was called at 1200 on coordinates AT 970553 to clear a tree line. The Command roup and read companies continued to move forward halting on occasion to prep" danger areas with air and artillery. Sporadic sniper fire was reteived by lead elements, but there was no major contact made. At 1452 the ead companies and the Command Group reached coordinates AT 972553 and presared to set in night defensive positions. Company K had been left back approximately 800 meters with several heat and a few battle dashalties, together with some supplies and equipment that had not been picked up reviously. Company K rejoined the remainder of the battalion after the equipment was flown out. At about 1630, a six man scout team from the 3-2 Section departed the battalion perimeter on a reconnaissance patrol



o the village of AN QUYEN (1). They observed a young Vietnamese male, ho, when he saw the Marines, ran away into the tall elephant grass dijacent to the village. The partol pursued this individual and in the process of searching in the grass for him discovered seven fresh camp fires and signs of recent occupancy of about 35 people. The patrol returned to the battalion's position and the area around AN QUYEN (1) was fired on periodically throughout the night by artillery.

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ne casualty due to small arms fire but avoided heavy contact by withcawing and calling another air strike on the objective? at 1220 the partalion CP Group received mortar and small arms fire from its rear. Mortars and helicopter fire were brought to bear on the enemy positions, while et the same time, the Command Group and all companies commenced moving West, toward the SONG THU BON River Of A Battalion Command Post was established at AT 942538 and the rifle companies began preparing defensive positions. At 1330 Company I, together with a platoon of tanks, joined the battalion and were integrated into the battalion defensive positions. Re-supply was completed by 1615 and further air and artillery preparatory fires were brought to bear on LE B.C (1). At 1800 on the 25th, the cumulative friendly desulty count was 51 KIn, 204 WIA, 9 WINE, and 9 MIA, while chemy casualties numbered 114 kIA and 5 detainees. Night positions were manned and at 2120 an amoush from Company

On the 26th at 0720, Companies T and M together with tanks commenced moving toward LE BAC (1) from West to East. Both air and artillery continued to fire on the objective. At 0940 Company I found 7 dead NVA and 22 freshly dry graves, which were opened and found to contain NVA dead. Company L received six rounds of mortar fire, wounding six men. The battalion's mortage returned fire on the suspected enemy positions and an artillery mission was called. At 1325 Company M made contact with an unknown size nemy force, receiving small arms and automatic weapons fire as well as RPG rounds directed at the supporting tanks. Company M returned fire, called air strikes on the enemy positions and directed tank fire, all of which resulted in suppressing the enemy. 5 NVA were killed and one captured. At 1520 a torrential downpour halted further contact and under cover of this min, the enemy broke contact and withdrew toward LE BAC (2), which is located to the East of the objective area. An air mission was requested and artillery was fired into this area was by the end of the days operations, friendly casualties totaled 56 KIA, 226 WIA, 9 MEA, and 9 WIANE, while known enemy losses were 67 KIA and 5 detainees. Defensive positions were established in LE BAC (1) and the battalion prepared to spend the night. During the night of 26-27 May, three hand grenades were thrown into Company K's positions wounding one man slightly. The Command Post received approximately 20 rounds of 81MM mortar ire. Artillery was called on suspected enemy mortar positions.

Orders from the 27th Marine Regiment had been received indicating that me company from the 1st Battalion would be helilifted into the area and wo companies from this battalion would be lifted out. This exchange began t 0938 and was essentially completed at 1435. Company C, of 1/27 had been rought in, and Companies K and M had been retracted. In the meantime, Companas I and L continued to search LE BAC (1) and at 1005, Company Locartized nother NVA. However, he was severely wounded and died prior to evacuation. number of weapons, ammunition, documents, rockets and rocket launchers bere discovered and were evacuated to 27th Regimental Headquarters has of 71200 total friendly casualties were 61 KIA, 228 WIA, 1 MIA, 9 WIANE, while cown enemy casualties numbered 173 KIA and 6 detainees. At 1220 Company L discovered 5 dead NVA, together with large quantities of rice and peanuts. at 1400, Company I discovered 12 fresh graves. These were epened and found



o contain recently killed NVA. At 1505, a helicopter CH-34, made a forced landing at grid coordinates AT 952541 and one platoon from Company C was dispatched to provide security. At 1600, the Command Group and two rifle companies commenced moving to a new location at AT 959529 and arrived at 1625. Immediately, preparations for night defensive positions were begun, helicopter re-supply was completed, and the platoon from Company C was return ed after the downed helicopter was retrieved.

Orders were received indicating that the First Battalion would relieve the Third Battalion on the 28th and that the two forces were to effect a link-up in the vicinity of Liberty Bridge. As a result, the battalion moved from its night position at 0805 on the morning of the 28th with Company I and Company C forward with tanks and the Command Group and Company I following in trace. At 0915 in the vicinity of AT 950532, Company I made contact with an enemy forcesentrenched in a tree line. Air strikes were called on the enemy positions and one tank was hit with an RPG round wounding three men. Contact remained heavy until approximately 1140 when Company I was able to break contact and withdraw to safe distance so that air and artillery could be fired into the enemy positions. After re-organizing Company I, the battalion moved along the dry stream bed toward the SONG THU BON River and then southwest to Liberty Bridge effecting link-up with lead elements of the 1st Battalion at approximately 1335. Just prior to the link-up, the Command Group received two 60MM mortar rounds resulting in two WIA's, who were placed on tanks. The column reached Liberty Bridge at about 1400.

In all cases, contact with the enemy followed the same general pattern. Friendly forces would approach a tree line from across an open field. The lead elements of the friendly forces would enter the tree line and would be taken under fire and pinned down. The follow up elements would be taken under fire as they attempted to move forward across the open ground to assist those units already in contact. The ranges were always under 150 meters and in many cases less than 50 meters. The enemy would not disengage but would continue in contact at these close ranges thus denying the friendly units the use of supporting arms. Communications generally remained good throughout the duration of the contacts, and no significant problems were encountered in this area.

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13. Administrative Matters

a. The method of re-supply used by this battalion was supply point distribution. All re-supplies were brought into battalion landing zones



and issued to the companies from that point. Re-supply requests were submitted by the companies to the S-4 representative with the Command droup who consolidated them and forwarded them on to the LSA. Initially the combat load was too great for the individual rifleman and the flak in jacket was discarded, as were the gas masks. The maintenance of those items evacuated for repair was good and while most of the items were floated several weapons were repaired and returned quite rapidly.

- b. Casualties were treated and evacuated as rapidly as the tactical situation would permit. The Naval Support activities Hospital supported the operation in an outstanding fashion.
- c. Communications were satisfactory throughout the operation both internally as well as externally. Only portable FM equipment was employed and it was more than adequate for all nets.
- 14. Special Equipment and Techniques. A complete list of medical equipment and medications used is attached as enclosure (1). During the hours of darkness the battalion perimeter was ordered not to return fire unless under ground attack. Likewise, the battalion mortars did not return fire when enemy mortar fire was received. This technique was employed in order to deny the enemy exact knowledge of the locations of friendly positions, and THE REPORT OF THE PROPERTY OF THE PARTY OF T proved very effective.

15. Commanders Analysis

The tactics used by the NVA units we encountered did not vary at any time. Several things learned were first, that all tree lines are danger areas and should be "prepped" prior to moving foot troops into them. Secondly, scout elements must be alert for the enemy's hidden positions. Third, tanks are feared by the enemy and can be used effectively with foot troops to dislodg. an entrenched enemy. Fourth, when the night defensive positions receive small arms fire or mortar fire the best procedure is to hold fire so as not to disclose friendly positions.

Psychological operations, although employed did not seem to have any effect on the enemy troops. Interrogation revealed that some of the enemy wanted to "CHIEU HOI" but were afraid that the Marines would shoot them if they attempted this. Perhaps more detailed instructions to both sides as to how a "BHIEU HOI" will be treated and the procedures to follow would be beneficial.

Only a handful of vivilians were encountered during the operation, no more than 100 throughout the entire period. Several were wounded and treated in the field while two civilians were evacuated for serious burns. None were rolocated.

16. Recommendations. None.
